Thank you for your interest in the Student Advisory Council for AHMI 2010. Taking part in the planning of AHMI is an exciting and challenging endeavor. The AHMI Planning Team relies heavily on the input and advice of the Student Advisory Council each year, so the position you are applying for is an important one. Please keep in mind that the role of the Advisory Council is to *advise*, not to actually plan.

In order to complete the application process, there are several steps.

1. Have your Campus/ Executive Director email ahmi@humanics.org with an endorsement of your candidacy. Please type “Student Advisory Council Nomination” in the subject line. This is not a reference letter and does not need to be more than a few sentences.
2. Address the following essay questions in one 2 page, double spaced document:
 - Please describe your interest in serving on the Advisory Council.
 - What do you hope to get out of your experience with American Humanics?
 - How have previous experiences led up to applying for this position?

Email your essay, as a Word document, to ahmi@humanics.org.

3. In the essay email, please submit the following information:
 - Name
 - Campus
 - Phone number
 - Email
 - Mailing Address (Fall and Winter Break Address)
 - A current resume with your educational, employment, and volunteer experiences
4. Your online profile must be up-to-date by the submission deadline.
5. The essay, resume, and the endorsement must be received by **November 14, 2008**.

After receiving essays, phone interviews will be conducted with selected candidates. Final interviews will be conducted at AHMI Indianapolis 2009, with the selected candidates announced at the AHMI Closing Ceremony. Below is the Position Description for 2010 Student Advisory Council. POSITION: 2010 AHMI Student Advisory Council member

PURPOSE: Student Advisory Council members will support the American Humanics National Office in planning, developing, and implementing the 2010 Management Institute.

POSITION RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Provide advice and leadership in conjunction with the Management Institute Faculty and the American Humanics Management/Leadership Institute™ Host Committee
- Serve as a positive role model for AHMI participants and other Advisory Council members
- Provide input to AHMI volunteers, presenters, and other resources needed for the Institute
- Serve as a representative of AH students nationwide in the planning process of the Institute
- Devote time from February 2009 through January 2010 to assist with the planning, development and implementation of AHMI 2010
- Participate in local institution AHSA campus fundraising efforts for the AHMI registration fee and other personal expenses (travel, lodging, etc.)
- Participate in the AHMI Advisory Council's initial planning meeting to be held February 2009. (AH National Office will underwrite applicable travel and lodging expenses.)
- Participate in one-hour conference calls with the Advisory Council every 6-8 weeks from March-December 2009
- Be available to assist full time on-site with the implementation of the 2010 American Humanics Management/Leadership Institute™
- Must arrive on-site one day before AHMI at or before 2pm. American Humanics will underwrite lodging expenses for this night only
- Collaborate with the American Humanics National Office to recommend appropriate programmatic ideas and provide constructive feedback to the AHMI Intern concerning Institute programming changes
- Author articles for AHMI newsletters upon request by AHMI Intern or National Staff
