

SueAnn Strom, Ph.D.

Dr. SueAnn Strom is the Vice President for Academic Partnerships at American Humanics. She is responsible for ensuring that academic standards of excellence on nearly 70 colleges and universities affiliated with American Humanics are met. Strom conducts campus visits providing support to new and on-going campuses ensuring the quality of American Humanics program including coursework, service learning activities and internships. In addition, Dr. Strom spearheads the AH research agenda which includes the annual Cohen Research Grants that focus on curriculum development and AH alumni career development in the nonprofit sector. Dr. Strom also oversees the NextGen Leaders Program annual evaluation and longitudinal research study.

Before joining American Humanics in 2006, Dr. Strom worked on a number of college and university campuses including six years as Vice President for student affairs at Southeast Missouri State University, Associate Professor of Higher Education at the University of Arkansas Little Rock, and nearly 20 years as an adjunct faculty member and student affairs professional positions at various colleges and universities.

Currently, Dr. Strom serves on the Board of Directors of the Council for Certification in Volunteer Administration and is an active presenter at the Association for Research on Nonprofit Organizations and Voluntary Action.

Strom holds a Bachelor of Arts degree in English from Ohio University, a Master of Arts degree in Guidance and Counseling from John Carroll University, and a Doctorate of Philosophy degree in Higher and Adult Education from the University of Missouri-Columbia.
